As we look forward to that day, let us partner with His heart by praying for the Rohingya to know the God who sees them.



Lord, the Rohingya are in Your sight! Thank you for:

- · More labourers among the Rohingya fields globally (Luke 10:2).
- · Further progress made towards the Rohingya having God's Word in their heart language.
- Unity & collaboration in the family of Rohingya labourers.
- · The gospel of the Kingdom being demonstrated and proclaimed among the Rohingya.

- Pray that the Rohingya see the One who sees them:
 - · Pray that the Rohingya see Scripture translation efforts as God's pursuit of them. Pray for faith that God wants to be personally known. Pray for grace over the Bible translation process.
 - Pray that the Rohingya personally encounter the God who sees them through powerful dreams, visions, and miraculous demonstrations of His power. Ask that their hearts remain open to God's invitation, responding with humility and faith.
 - Pray that the Rohingya believers and churches increasingly reflect the likeness of Jesus as they behold Him.
 - Pray that the Rohingya in seemingly unseen places, such as Saudi Arabia, Pakistan, & China, hear the gospel of the Kingdom and see it demonstrated (Luke 10:9).

Jesus, you seek and save the lost. You see the lost and needy with compassion, as sheep without a shepherd. Thank you, God, that your plan of redemption extends to the Rohingya. You truly see them and love them better than anyone else can. Amen.
