As a shepherd cares for his herd in the day when he is among his scattered sheep, so I will care for My sheep and will deliver them from all the places to which they were scattered on a cloudy and gloomy day."' (Ezekiel 34:11-12)

FOLLOWING THE SHEPHERD

Throughout Scripture, God reveals Himself as the Shepherd who seeks the lost, gathers the scattered, and leads His people. Rohingya believers know this reality well. Amid uncertainty, displacement, and hardship, they continue to experience the care of the Good Shepherd. Over the past year, many Rohingya Christians have faced unexpected trials and difficult journeys. Yet God has remained faithful. Like Paul, they have learned to trust the Shepherd's hand when the road is unclear. He leads, provides, and sustains them.

As we pray today, let us praise Jesus, the Good Shepherd, who gives life and hope and gathers His people into one flock under His care.

Thank God for:

- Rohingya brothers and sisters who have come to faith in the past year, and for the joy this brings in heaven (Luke 15:7).
- Answers to prayer for more workers, and for Rohingya believers who are sharing their faith and helping others follow Jesus (Luke 10:2).
- Leaders within the Rohingya Christian community who care for others and show love in practical ways (John 13:35).
- The Good Shepherd's help and protection for Rohingya believers during difficult journeys and times of change. Thank Him for comfort and strength through His Word, especially Psalm 124 and Isaiah 43:1-21.
- Progress in Bible translation, and for the use of media and technology to share God's word widely among Rohingya communities (Matthew 13:1-8).

Prayer Points:

- Pray that Rohingya believers remain strong under pressure, knowing the Good Shepherd is with them each day (Psalm 23:6).
- Pray for Bible translation work: for unity, safety, wisdom, and that God's Word will bring real change (Isaiah 55:11).
- Pray for government leaders in Rohingya host countries to act justly, love mercy, and make wise decisions (Micah 6:8; 1 Timothy 2:1-4).
- Pray for God's Spirit to be poured out on Rohingya communities, with dreams and visions pointing people to Him (Acts 2:17-21).
- Pray for deep spiritual hunger and for believers to reach out to those who are lost and searching (Luke 15:4).
